7. CONSENT is saying YES to something	8. Consent is needed for ALL sexual activity. It CANNOT be fully or legally given when under the influence!	 9. So during your next party remember your tolerance may be different & YOUR CONSENT IS ALWAYS NEEDED for anything to happen.



Consent

<u>YES</u>

- Feeling happy, enthusiastic and excited
- Both talked and agreed what we like and don't before having sex
- Know how to tell if the vibe changes for either of us
- Talked about pregnancy, STIs and have contraception sorted
- Planned a safe and private space

<u>UNSURE</u>

- They say or you feel 'Maybe' / 'Not sure' / 'Meh' about sex
- Silence when asking questions about contraception etc
- Either of you have slowed down, hesitating, avoiding eye contact
- If someone has a learning need or mental health need

PAUSE..... is this what I or THEY really want?



<u>NO!</u>

- You or they are under 16 years old, there's a big age difference between you
- The person has a position of power over you
- Drugs or alcohol are involved
- Person is asleep, passed out
- Having to promise sex
- Nagging, comparing to others
- Taking or sending intimate pictures ('dick pics') under 18 years old
